# St. Paul's by Fr. Philip and St. Paul's Executive Ministry Team

You have no excuse...when you judge others.
Romans 2:1

t's been more than three years since we have conducted a congregational survey. Your Executive Ministry Team (Marion, Joe, Doug, Liz, Kira, Jeanne, Laurie, Betsy, and Philip) decided this is a good time to ask for your thoughts about life at St. Paul's. We spent several weeks this summer crafting 30 questions to ask our members for a comprehensive survey of Worship, Formation, Fellowship, Pastoral Care, and Mission & Service activities at St. Paul's.

Some of the questions are practical, such as, where would you like to hold coffee hour when all of the construction is finished? Some of the questions are more subjective and spiritual in nature, such as, which parts of worship are consistently meaningful for you? Some of the questions are multiple-choice and some are open-response.

The survey is intended to be completed anonymously, although you will find a place at the end where you have the option of adding your name to your survey, which will be helpful if you would like to hear back from your Executive Ministry Team. We encourage everyone to complete the survey online by following the 'Survey Link' found in your weekly E newsletter. Completing the survey online is fast and makes it much easier for our Executive Ministry Team to compile and review your answers. You can also complete the survey using this September Edition of *The Courier*. In order to complete the survey by hand, please use a blue or black pen to fill in your answers in the pages of *The Courier*. Then mail or bring your completed survey back to St. Paul's and place your survey in the box near the Peace Altar.

We have two purposes for *St. Paul's 2024 Survey*. The first purpose is to gather more information from our members, so we can make wise decisions as we plan and guide the ministries, programs and work of the church. The second purpose is to give you more information about our ministries and programs; we hope you will learn something new as you read and respond to the questions of the survey.

Please be assured that our purpose is never to judge any of our members. Some of us might feel inadequate for not participating in any Fellowship activities, or for not participating in any Formation activities, or for not participating in Worship in person. We encourage you to set aside any feelings of self-judgment. The central message of our Christian faith is that God loves us and comes into our lives just as we are, not as we expect ourselves to be.

The questions in the survey are arranged in six sections: Worship, Formation, Mission & Service, Fellowship, Pastoral Care, and Communications. We have included brief explanations of the first five categories on the next page.

Thank you in advance for devoting 15-30 minutes to read and answer the questions on the survey. It might be most helpful to think of your responses, not as your votes on any particular issue, but as <u>your story</u> of <u>your</u> experience at St. Paul's. When we have collected all of these unique, personal stories your Executive Ministry Team (Marion, Joe, Doug, Liz, Kira, Jeanne, Laurie, Betsy, and Philip) will read each and every one and look for patterns and information in the responses. We'll report back to you about what we have learned. Then we'll use this information to help guide many of our decisions for the next 2-5 years.

### Many of the activities of St. Paul's are supported and coordinated through the efforts of five ministry teams:

#### **Fellowship**

St. Paul's Community Fellowship Team organizes activities and encourages our members to participate in fellowship activities. Although some of our activities have been curtailed due to our renovation project, likely activities in 2025 include: Coffee Hour Fellowship, Friday Potluck Suppers, Receptions for Special Services, Funerals, and Concerts, and our Maundy Thursday Parish Supper. Liz Belden-Handler is the convener of our Community Fellowship Team.

#### **Formation**

St. Paul's Formation Ministry Team includes several independent activities and groups organized and led by a diverse group of leaders. A dedicated group of lay people leads our Sunday morning program for children: *Godly Play.* Adults are offered a range of weekly and monthly activities, including *Feminist Theology, Contemplative Prayer, SPC Readers, and Bible Study.* Most years at St. Paul's, at least one or two retreats are offered, many of which are day retreats. Jeanne Avery is the convener of our Formation Team.

#### Worship

St. Paul's Worship Ministry Team helps plan our worship services and coordinates the work of the ten Worship related leadership groups: Ushers, Lectors, Coffee Hour Hosts, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Guild, Flower Guild, Choir, Acoloytes, Communion Bread Bakers, and those who write the Prayers of the People. Laurie Sanderson is the convener of our Worship Ministry Team.

#### Mission & Service

St. Paul's Mission and Service Team helps plan, implement, and oversee activities related to the ministry of Mission and Service as we reach out to serve others in our community and the world. Members are most often the ones who take the lead, initiating new efforts and building new partnerships. Members of St. Paul's are currently involved with the following groups and efforts: *The Samaritan Center, YMCA Senior Residents, Cristosal, Haiti Education Mission, The Open Pantry, Interfaith Works, and A Tiny Home for Good.* This list is bound to change and grow in the coming months, as our members find new ways to "seek and serve Christ in all persons." (BCP p. 305) Betsy Elkins is the convener of our Mission & Service Team.

#### **Pastoral Care**

At St. Paul's, pastoral care is a team effort. Everyone participates, even if in some informal way. Members give others rides to worship services. Some of us check in with each other by phone or text. We are led by our priest, but everyone plays an essential part, fulfilling the promise of our Baptismal Covenant: "Seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbors as yourself."

Kira Dirghalli is the lay leader of the Pastoral Care Team; she convenes meetings and helps coordinate care for our members. The Pastoral Care Team is a group of about a dozen members who meet several times a year and take extra care to make sure that those who are enduring extra challenges are receiving support from St. Paul's. Members of the Pastoral Care Team make phone calls, write notes, and visit members in their homes and institutional settings. Some of them bring communion to members when they are not able to attend worship services at St. Paul's.






